What has happened since our last meeting?

- The participants of this meeting spent Christmas and New Year with their families.
- The Coalition of Polish Americans quickly reacted by sending a protest letter after the new left-wing government dissolved the public television station TVP.
- Zbyszek started preparing summaries of last year's meetings, highlighting issues that we should address again.
- Zbyszek started working on the Polish version of the brochure about Poland replacing the text in the Polish Americans Contribution column with text that would be specific to Poles.

- Zbyszek, after including all suggestions to the WWII Commemoration and Compensation Resolution, sent it to several interested people from the PACT group.

We talked about:

- Dr. Gene made a few minor corrections to the draft WWII Commemoration and Compensation Resolution, which Andrzej immediately implemented.
- The Polish Club at UT and its extremely consistent activities. No other Polish American organization can compare with them.
- The importance of educating young people especially in Poland and around the world. This is necessary to build a civil state. Szymon suggested that instead of developing close relationships with American legislators, we should devote our time and energy to this project. Dr. Gene rightly described what needs to be done: teach a critical thinking. However, no one had any idea how to do it.
- Situation in Poland after a new government of Donald Tusk took over.

What was decided:

- Everyone who can should contact their congressional representative's office and schedule a meeting with the legislative team re the Compensation Resolution.
- Dr. Gene will attempt to attend a WEP/GPO Task Force meeting on Monday.
- Dr. Gene will meet with his Representative, Abigail Spanberger, in January and ask her
 to sponsor the Compensation Resolution. She is a Democrat who prides herself as
 being the most bipartisan Democrat in the House of Representatives.

What has happened since our last meeting?

- Dr. Gene submitted question for Marcy Kaptur (as Jonathan Silverstein had asked to do before the meeting with her) whether she was going to support the Compensation Resolution now (she promised to get involved after the election in Poland). This is in reference of the meeting with the Congresswoman on January 25 organized by the Polish Club at UT. Zbyszek wonders if Jonathan will present Gene's question, because questions are screened beforehand (once Zbyszek's question was omitted, because "did not fit").
- Andrzej at his PAC -New Jersey Division meeting reminded to contact legislators from Ways & Means re WEP as Gene had requested.
- Zbyszek called Andrew Garbarino's Long Island office re the Compensation Resolution and was directed to call his DC office and contact Mr. Garbarino's legislative team directly. Zbyszek followed the advice and received an email to the head of the Legislative Team Kevin.Ganon@mail.house.gov
- Andrzej spoke at the Katyn Monument last Sunday during a demonstration (`100 people showed up) against the unconstitutional behavior of the new Polish government.
- John Czop informed Zbyszek that Lech Walesa was invited by the organizers of the 60 Million event which will take place in February in Miami. This is an expensive event for the participants, Halina recalled when she was there with Zbyszek last year.
- Arkadiusz Mularczyk, head of the reparations team, told PAP (Polish Press Agency) that
 he will soon submit a draft resolution to the Sejm where
 "We will call on the government to take action during this parliamentary term on the
 international forum to seek war reparations from Germany."

We talked about:

- Dr. Gene introduced us to a new Alert on HR.82 and its Senate version S.597. Currently, 50 senators are co-sponsors, and an additional 11 are needed.
- Should we wait until we hear a clear statement from the new Polish government on compensation for Poland for WWII? Ryszard noted that the issue of reparations is perceived negatively by legislators and gave the example of African-Americans seeking compensation for slavery in California. Zbyszek saw no connection or comparison with the Polish case. Dr. Gene: PASI has decided to wait until the reaction of the new Polish government is known.
- The report from the last meeting was read.
- Films about Poland available on the Netflex were discussed by Jola and Dr. Gene.

What was decided:

- <u>Dr. Gene asked us to join the Call to Action</u>: The National WEP/GPO Repeal Task Force is launching our 2024 campaign next week on 16 January to press 10 targeted House members and 10 targeted Senate members to advance H.R. 82 and S. 597. Details in Gene's email or please contact him or Zbyszek directly.
- Dr. Gene will NOT meet with his Representative, Abigail Spanberger until he receives the green light from PASI which is awaiting plans of the new Polish government re compensations for WWII.

 + about the results of research on the promotion of Poland abroad at the Consulate in New York (Halina participated),

The program is available in Polish, Spanish, Catalonian, Portuguese and is prepared in English. Initially, 30 education specialists worked on it for a year and a half. Currently, 10 people are involved in its improvement, mostly par-time. Not only schools but also individuals can apply for access.
- PAC Financial Statement was sent to Ryszard for 2022 and 23 after the intervention of Zbyszek and Dr. Pienkos. Ms. Jaminska's comment was surprising: zk is no longer ND, so he should not ask for it.
- The PASI letter on Ukraine was criticized by all but one person.
- Responsibilities of the National Executive Council. We read the PAC By-laws.
- Youth education.
- Report from the last meeting was read and discussed.

What was decided:

- Gienek proposed shortening our meetings to an hour and starting them by reading the report from the previous meeting. This will require returning to using the pipe.

We welcomed a new participant: Ursula.

What has happened since our last meeting?

 Jola was elected President of the PAC Michigan division. She has plans to increase membership to 100 people and wants to decide what to do with their building.

We talked about:

- The report from the last meeting was read and commented on.
- Progress on the WEP/GPO repeal project. Dr. Gene reported that the "natives" were becoming restless because they had not seen any action to advance the bill to the markup session. Gienek informed us that currently the bill is supported by 307 members of the House and 53 Senators.
- "Flavor of Poland", series II. Krzysiek reminded us that we need to reach out to marketing specialists. Halina's explained what she experienced and what could really work was simply personal contacts.
- An educational program for teaching values and skills to students prepared by Leader 100. Krzysiek: we have very limited time and resources and we have plenty of other projects. He argued that it would distract us from important projects. He very strongly opposed against getting involved in helping spread info about the Leader 100 program. Andrzej agreed with him. Zbyszek was of the opposite opinion, he saw a great opportunity in preparing young generation for adult life offered by this program. In his experience, it would take very little time and effort to advertise this to teachers.
- PASI Statement on Ukraine. Wojtek offered to answer questions. Zbyszek wanted to know what the purpose of writing this letter was and what Wojtek's idea was to end the war in Ukraine. Instead of answering, Wojtek said there were too many emotions around these topics and instead offered to organize an educational meeting. Several meeting participants expressed interest.
- Resolution regarding Compensation. Participants were against resuming this project for the reason: that the new Polish government is not interested in obtaining compensation from Germany. According to Zbyszek this issue was still fresh since its global introduction last year by PiS. Therefore, we should not worry so much about the attitude of Tusk's government. Keeping this issue alive would be a strategic move.
- The list of proposed projects that our PACT group could get involved was read.

What was decided:

- Zbyszek encouraged everyone who knows teachers, especially teachers of Polish Saturday Schools, to inform them about advantages of the Leader 100 educational program and explain how to obtain these programs.

What has happened since our last meeting?

Ted Deutch said that 90% of Jews were killed in Poland. And Rep. Mike Lowler (R, dist.#17, NY) added that demonstrators wanted to send Jews to Poland because they were murdered there.
- Krzysiek was present today at the meeting with Jerzy Kwaśniewski (President of Ordo luris) at the Sokół Club in Kraków. And he plans to meet Mr. Kwaśniewski again.

We talked about:

- Report from the last meeting was read, commented on and corrected.
- Celebration of the May 3rd Constitution in California, Long Island, Ohio and Michigan. On Friday, Halina and Zbyszek went to Our Lady of Poland in South Hampton (the round trip took almost 5 hours). On Sunday, PAC-LI members participated in the Academy at the Polish American Home in Glen Cove (the mayor of the town spoke). Jola: on Thursday, at the Consulate in Chicago, Paweł Zyzak announced his return to Poland in June. Jola's husband took photo with Antoni Macierewicz and got his phone No. Jola was impressed by the Sunday event organized by Ania Bankowski at the Church in Orchard Lake. Children from 2 schools performed. Dr. Andrzej: the first Sunday in May there is Polish Day in the Golden Gate Park, which is larger and nicer than Central Park. - Ordo Iuris calls the referendum being prepared in the European Union a "referendum on the partition" of Poland.
- What should be our priority: WEP or involvement in the situation in Europe (Krzysiek).
- D. Pogorzelski's election defeat because of lack of involvement of Polonia in politics.
- Lack of goals in the PAC mission to build political structures (Jola, Krzysiek).
- A right-wing patriotic coalition without PiS is being born in Poland (Gienek).

What was decided, what is planned:

- We should go to https://joinpasi.org/ on May 14 and 16 and select those dates in ACTION and click on them at the appropriate time to automatically send emails.

- Swedish Deluge. The Russians, Kozaks and Transylvanians, also attacked Poland.

- Swedish deluge. Dr. Andrzej: the losses exceeded the losses that Poland suffered during WWI and WWII combined. This is considered the first attempt at partition.
- Halina's findings: Polish human losses in WWI 1,130 k (the US 116 k). WWII: Poland 6 million (the US 418 k). The US in the Korean War 36,6 k, in the Vietnam War 58,5 k.
- The PAC collected \$300 k in one weekend for Ukraine. So far, they have not collected a penny for "Flavor of Poland" thanks to which just for \$50 k millions of Americans could learn about the activities of the Polish American Congress on its 80th Anniversary.



Congressman John James (R, MI #10)

What has happened since our last meeting?

- Adam Domaradzki sent info about the III Conference of Polonia Initiatives which will be held on June 28-30 at Arcadia Royal Hotel in Warsaw.
- Jola told us about a meeting called by local Congressman John James (R), attended by 50 representatives of Polonia. Apparently, 80 k Polish Americans live in his district.
- Anna Maria Anders in Italy will be replaced by the former Polish Ambassador to the US Ryszard Schnepf, son of Maksymilian, Jew from Ukraine, a member of the anti-Polish KPP, an officer of the Stalinist Military Information, a traitor to Poland. In 1945, together with a separate special unit, he took part in the "Augustów operation". As a high-ranking NKVD officer and colonel, while training new staff, was very actively involved in the Sovietization of Poland for decades. In the 1950s, he was an employee of the UB, and then of the SB and LWP in Krakow, where, he helped pacify the strikes in 1981
- There is still no response from the EC to Ryszard's letter (sent May 16) regarding dues.

These questions were not answered. Instead, it was suggested that questions to candidates should be unprovocative and polite.

 - 6) <u>Donation to support Ukraine:</u> Mr. Pienkos' brochure lists the amount of \$300,000 in the annual financial settlement is \$700,000. We are curious, why this difference? This was not mentioned.

W latach 70-tych i 80-tych wybudowano 557 nowych przedsiębiorstw, w tym:71 fabryk, 18 zakładów mięsnych, 16 fabryk odzieżowych, 14 chłodni, 10 zakładów elektronicznych, 10 fabryk mebli, 9 zakładów hutnictwa żelaza i metali nieżelaznych, 9 elektrociepłowni, 7 elektrowni, 7 fabryk samochodów i ich części, 5 cementowni, 5 kopalni węgla kamiennego. W okresie Gierka zbudowano: Dworzec Centralny w Warszawie, Fabryka Samochodów Małolitrażowych w Tychach, Huta Katowice, Trasa Katowicka, czyli "gierkówka", Trasa Łazienkowska w Warszawie, Kombinat Paliwowo-Energetyczny Bełchatów, Rafineria Północna Gdańsk, Kopalnie: Borynia, Śląsk i Trzydziestolecia PRL, Elektrownie: w Dolnej, Kozienicach, Rybniku, Huta miedzi w Głogowie, Kopalnia miedzi w Rudnej, Zakłady Azotowe Włocławek. Zbudowano prawie w całości polską energetykę, w tym elektrownie węglowe – Bełchatów (4400 MW), Kozienice (2600 MW), Jaworzno III (1200 MW), Dolna Odra (1800 MW), Rybnik (1800 MW), Połaniec (I blok) – oraz wodne w Żarnowcu (700 MW) i Włocławku (160 MW), które wciąż dostarczają połowę zużywanego w Polsce prądu. W ciągu 30 lat, które minęły od tego czasu, wybudowano tylko jedną elektrownię (o mocy 4400 MW). Wybudowano prawie 2 miliony mieszkań czynszowych. Były to całe osiedla i mieszkania które Polacy mogli wykupić za grosze, one też zostały wybudowane za Gierka.
